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August 6, 2014

The Regular Meeting of the Governing Body for the City of Ogden was scheduled on Wednesday, August 6, 2014 at 7:00 p.m.

The meeting was called to order at 7:01 p.m.

The following members were present: Ken Carroll, Paul Werle, Ed Burch, Brian Still and Mayor Pence. Attorney Irvine was not present.

Mayor Pence invited the public to present comments to the Governing Body.

Approval of Agenda:

Werle commented that he would like to add a discussion about Occupational Licenses prior to Agenda item #6.

Burch moved to approve the agenda with the addition. Seconded by Still. Motion carried.

Approval of Minutes:

Burch moved to approve the Minutes of the July 16, 2014 Council Meeting. Seconded by Werle. Motion carried.

PUBLIC HEARING: John Welch-Sink, Gordon & Associates: Presentation of the 2015 Budget. John Welch-Sink, Gordon & Associates, presented the 2015 Budget. The total mill levy is 36.440 and is comprised of the following: General Fund- 16.918, Bond & Interest Fund-4.392 and Employee Benefit Fund 15.130. Welch commented that the Budget has been published and that a copy has been available at City Hall for anyone to review. He stated that in presenting the budget, there were no changes from what was presented at the Work Session.

Mayor Pence opened the Public Hearing for comments from the public. No comments were voiced. Mayor Pence closed the Public Hearing.

Adoption of the 2015 Budget.

Still moved to adopt the 2015 Budget as prepared by Sink, Gordon & Associates. Seconded by Burch. Werle voted against. Motion carried.

Renewal of permission for Boy Scouts to use stone building in the City Park for storage of their equipment.

Carroll moved to allow the Boy Scouts to use the stone building in the City Park for storage of the equipment for the next year. Seconded by Burch. Motion carried.

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Discussion of Occupational Licenses.

Werle suggested the ordinance for occupational licenses be changed to set a dollar amount earned on the requirement as to whether a person would be required to get an occupational license. He suggested that anyone making in excess of \$2500 would be required to obtain an occupational license.

Werle moved to refund Randy Hobbs the \$15 fee charged to him for an occupational license. Seconded by Still. Motion carried.

Troy Ward: Request Occupational License for Ward Mowing at 114 Walnut Street.

Consensus of the Council was to inform Troy Ward that he doesn't need a license.

City Foreman: Misc. Items.

Nations commented that the motor on the chipper spreader locked up and cannot be repaired or replaced.

Council discussed street maintenance options throughout the town.

Nations commented that the City needs a chop saw to cut water lines.

Burch moved to allow Nations to purchase a saw not to exceed \$900. Seconded by Werle. Motion carried.

Nations inquired about purchasing a stick welder.

Consensus of Council was to have him get prices quote and present them at the next meeting.

Council discussed the issue of employees taking city vehicles home for lunch.

Consensus of the Council was to allow employees to take city vehicles home for lunch.

Council discussed the maintenance of the dead end at the 300 block of 15th street.

Burch inquired as to when the lifeguards would be receiving their \$100 year-end bonus.


